


Introduction



While the Latino population's growth and growing role in America society are widely noted in the media and in the popular consciousness, the virtual Latino absence from the media pundancy that interprets our reality and helps to define critical issues in general that face this society is an issue of much concern within the Latino community. For example, [one recent analysis](#) found that in one week they sampled that only 3.2 percent of guests on the major Sunday news and public affairs television shows were Latino.

The Latino population of New York City in 2010 was 2,336,076, or 28.6 percent of the total population. This represents a 31.0 percent increase since 1990, when the Latino numbered 1,783,511, or 24.4 percent of the city's total population. New York City's Latino population is one of the most diverse in the United States based on national origin, with no one subgroup making up a majority. According to the 2010 Census, Puerto Ricans were the largest Latino group, making up 31.0 percent of the total, closely followed by Dominicans (24.7 percent of the total). The Latino national-origin groups making up the next largest share of total Latinos in the city are: Mexicans (13.7 percent), Ecuadorans (7.2 percent) and Colombians (4.1 percent). Geographically.

Covering this large and diverse population, representing nearly one in every three New Yorkers, is a major challenge for the news media. The need to draw on resources from this community becomes a critical aspect of understanding its internal dynamics as well as its impact on the broader city's politics and policy discussions.



The National Institute for Latino Policy (NiLP), in collaboration with the New York Chapter of the National Hispanic Media Coalition (NHMC), worked with local cable station NY1 News to hold a meeting on October 26, 2011 with the station's executives and reporters with Latino community leaders to discuss this and related issues. One of the outcomes of this meeting was the identification of the need for a listing of Latino experts that could serve as a resource for the station. The result was this publication, *2012 New York City Latino Experts Media Resource Guide*.

Based on a survey of Latino opinion leaders who are members of The NiLP Network on Latino Issues, a survey was conducted that resulted in this listing of over 100 individuals with expertise on different aspects of the Latino experience in New York and the United States in general. This is not a definitive list, but we hope it can serve as a starting point for the city's media in developing their own listing of Latino experts that can help increase the Latino presence before their camera, microphones and on their printed and online pages. Special thanks to Marta Garcia, Co-Chair and Founder of the New York Chapter of the NHMC for her long-term media advocacy and ongoing support. The production of this report benefitted greatly from the volunteer efforts of Nicholas Arture.

While initially the result of our meeting with NY1 News, we are distributing this Guide to the media in general and to the Latin community. Besides its use as a resource for the media, it can also serve as a resource for the Latino community in terms of speakers, consultants and other needs requiring experts. We also hope it can serve as a model for other major Latino media markets.

As part of our collaboration with the National Hispanic Media Coalition, NiLP is also working to develop the NHMC Latino Experts Project funded by the Kellogg Foundation. The purpose of this project is to identify local policy experts on different topics in various target markets. The project will be visiting the top 12 television markets and identify experts in each in education, health, immigration, public safety, the economy/business, civil rights and media. If needed, media training will be provided. The local markets include: 1) New York; 2) Los Angeles; 3) Chicago; 4) Philadelphia; 5) Dallas-Fort Worth; 6) Houston; 7) San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose; 8) Boston; 9) Atlanta; 10) Washington, D.C.; 11) Detroit; 12) Phoenix. 
